

2012 INTERNATIONAL CODES

2012 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE® (IBC®)

The scope includes all buildings except detached one- and twofamily dwellings and townhouses up to three stories. Previous editions of the IBC have been adopted at the state or local level in all 50 United States plus Washington D.C. Now in its fifth edition, the 2012 IBC contains many important changes such as:

NONSTRUCTURAL

- All definitions are included in Chapter 2.
- Classifications for a variety of health-care related facilities have been clarified.
- Covered- and open-mall provisions revised to fully address the construction of open malls.
- Clarified provisions for incidental-use rooms and spaces.
- Modified provisions addressing exterior wall projections.
- Reformatted requirements for protection of vertical openings through floors.
- Automatic sprinkler systems required where upholstered furniture and mattresses are manufactured or stored.
- Increased capacity for stairways and other egress components in buildings with sprinklers and an emergency voice/alarm communication system.
- Clarification of when unenclosed stairways can be used as a part of the means of egress system.
- In three- and four-exit buildings, some exits are now permitted to serve a portion of a story rather than an entire story.

STRUCTURAL

- Wind design requirements extensively revised.
- Wind load maps are now based on ultimate design wind speeds.
- New terminology for wind speeds.
- Updated seismic ground motion maps.
- The term "occupancy category" changed to "risk category."
- Special inspection requirements for structural steel and masonry construction are now based on referenced standards.
- Penetration firestop and fire-resistant joint systems in high-rise buildings and in Risk Category III or IV structures require special inspection.
- Modifications to the seismic provisions of ACI 318 Appendix D. (722 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE® FOR ONE- AND TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS (IRC°)

This comprehensive code comprises all building, plumbing, mechanical, fuel gas and electrical requirements for one- and twofamily dwellings and townhouses up to three stories. Now in its fifth edition, the IRC contains many important changes regarding:

- New Seismic Design Categories maps.
- Exterior wall clearances to lot lines.
- Wireless smoke alarms.
- Prescriptive roof connections to resist wind uplift forces.
- Required clearance between townhouse separation walls and roof penetrations.
- Prescriptive requirements for isolated masonry pier foundations.
- Gypsum board under non fire-resistance rated floor assemblies.
- New simplified method for wall bracing.
- Prescriptive design of whole-house ventilation systems.
- Gray water recycling systems. (900 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE® (IFC®)

The IFC contains regulations to safeguard life and property from fires and explosion hazards. Topics include general precautions, emergency planning and preparedness, fire department access and water supplies, automatic sprinkler systems, fire alarm systems, special hazards, and the storage and use of hazardous materials. Now in its fifth edition, key changes to the IFC include:

- Complete reformatting into eight parts that correlate to a specific area of regulation.
- New requirements for: photovoltalic solar cells on roofs; portable fire extinguishers in Group A, B, and E occupancies; and automated LP-Gas cylinder exchange cabinets.
- Revised automatic sprinkler protection requirements for upholstered furniture and mattresses.
- New requirements for dry cleaning plants. (538 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL CODES

2012 INTERNATIONAL PLUMBING CODE® (IPC®)

First published in 1995, the IPC provides minimum regulations for plumbing facilities in terms of both performance and prescriptive objectives, and provides for the acceptance of new and innovative products, materials, and systems. Important changes include:

- Requirements for the design of a Siphonic Roof Drainage System.
- Gray water recycling requirements have moved to the body of the code in a new Chapter 13.
- Air admittance valves complying with standard ASSE 1049 are now allowed for venting chemical waste systems.

The IPC also includes its companion document, 2012 International Private Sewage Disposal Code®, for design, installation, and inspection of private sewage disposal systems. (264 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE® (IMC®)

Establishes minimum regulations for mechanical systems using prescriptive and performance-related provisions. First introduced in 1996, the IMC was developed with broad-based principles that make possible the use of new materials, methods and design. Changes include:

- New and existing mechanical systems must be maintained in accordance with ASHRAE/ACCA/ANSI Standard 180.
- Includes requirements for underground grease ducts.
- Air dispersion systems are now allowed. (154 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL FUEL GAS CODE® (IFGC®)

Addresses the design and installation of fuel gas systems and gas fired appliances through requirements that emphasize performance. Changes include:

- All piping, tubing and fittings in a fuel gas system must bear the manufacturer's identification.
- Clarification that gypsum board requires reduced clearances to combustibles the same as any other combustible material.
- Requirement of flashback arrestors and check valves in fuel gas systems used with oxygen. (184 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE® (IECC®)

Introduced in 1998, the IECC addresses energy efficiency on several fronts including cost savings, reduced energy usage, conservation of natural resources and the impact of energy usage on the environment. Important changes in this sixth edition include:

- A comprehensive set of changes for residential buildings includes measures to improve the thermal envelope, HVAC systems and electrical systems.
- Commercial enhancements include required energy savings for windows, doors and skylights; thermal envelope efficiency; and increased efficiencies for installed HVAC equipment. (116 pages)

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2012 INTERNATIONAL EXISTING BUILDING CODE® (IEBC®)

Encourages the use and reuse of existing buildings. The code covers repair, alteration, addition and change of occupancy for existing buildings and historic buildings, while achieving appropriate levels of safety without requiring full compliance with the new construction requirements contained in the other I-Codes.
